1번 대화를 듣고, 여자의 마지막 말에 대한 남자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

5번 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Amy, how was your field trip to Dublin?

W: Dad, everything was good, but one thing really bothered me.

M: What was that?

W: I felt bad because of what some visitors did there.

M: Like what? Did they make noise or litter?

W: No, but I was bothered by some graffiti on the historic buildings. I don't understand why they do such things.

M: Oh, that's awful! How could they do that?

W: I even saw several names carved on the walls of the castles. Isn't that against the law?

W: Many studies show that they also work as a natural humidifier.
